Critical

FB-ISAO has assessed the general Physical Threat Level for US Faith-Based Organizations as "CRITICAL." As per FB-ISAO's definitions of the Physical Threat Levels, "CRITICAL" means that an event is underway or expected imminently.

FB-ISAO Cyber Threat Level:

Elevated

FB-ISAO has assessed the general Cyber Threat Level for US Faith-Based Organizations as "ELEVATED." As per FB-ISAO's definitions of the Cyber Threat Levels, "ELEVATED" means FB-ISAO is not aware of any specific or targeted cyber threats, but there is a concern that the general risk of cyber threat activity is higher than normal.

To further enhance our capabilities, we're launching regional/local Information Sharing Communities (ISCs) on our FB-ISAO Slack workspace for any community that requests it. These private channels will be for members with interests in specific geographic areas to easily collaborate and share information with one another.

Largely due to the health threat we are all grappling with, it is important, now more than ever, to further develop relationships and foster geographic-specific information sharing and collaboration so we can work together to reduce risk while enhancing community preparedness, security, and resilience.

FB-ISAO recently implemented an incident reporting workflow capability in Slack for members to report and share incidents occurring in their communities. In contrast, the intent of the ISCs are to share information that may not rise to the level of an incident, but would be good for situational awareness, such as other local security incidents, law enforcement, or fusion center reports. Likewise, ISCs could be used to share other regional / locally-specific items of interest such as upcoming events, questions of others in the community, requests for assistance, or preparedness, response and recovery needs or ideas, as well as other information local members may want to share with one another.

FB-ISAO is supported by a great team and has fantastic volunteer leaders contributing to our Advisory Board, the Business Resilience Group, and in other ways. The ISCs are intended to further enhance our community and collaboration in support of the FB-ISAO mission to provide members with information, analysis, and capabilities to help reduce risk while enhancing preparedness, security, and resilience.
